Colonel Kyle M. Hogan Commander

In 1989, Colonel Kyle M. Hogan enlisted in the United States Army as a UH-1 Crew Chief with E co 5th Aviation Regiment Ft Polk, LA. He later served with the 28th ID (WVARNG) as a UH-1 crew chief. September 1997, from the University of North Carolina at Charlotte, Hogan was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in the Aviation Branch.

In 1999, after completing the Aviation Officer Basic Course and the UH-60 Aircraft Qualification Course he reported to Camp Stanley Korea, Republic of Korea and was assigned to 2-2nd Aviation Regiment. While assigned to the Wild Card Battalion he served as the Delta Company XO, and Charlie Company Operations Officer. In 2000, Colonel Hogan was assigned to C co, A co, and HHC 2-82nd Aviation Regiment. Then assigned to the Corsair Battalion he served as a Flight Platoon Leader, Company Executive Officer, and Assistant Battalion Operations Officer. At the 82nd Abn Div, Colonel Hogan deployed in support of Operation Joint Forge and SFOR-9 to Bosnia and Herzegovina. In 2003, Colonel Hogan was assigned to the 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault) where he served as the Battalion S4 and later Commander of HHC 9-101st and deployed in support of OIF I.



Colonel Hogan reported to 160th SOAR (Abn) in 2004, where he served as Flight Platoon Leader, Company Executive Officer, Company Commander, Battalion S3, and Battalion Executive Officer, culminating his assignment as the Maintenance director for the US Army Special Operation Aviation Command. While assigned to the 160th SOAR (Abn), Colonel Hogan deployed multiple times in support of OIF and OEF. In 2016 following, his successful assignment in the 160th SOAR (Abn) Colonel Hogan was selected to serve as the 1st Armored Division (1AD), Combat Aviation Brigade (CAB) 127th Aviation Support Battalion (ASB) Commander from May 2016 through May 2018. During his time in the 127th ASB, Colonel Hogan led the unit through multiple support operations in the NORTHCOM, CENTCOM, and EUCOM AOR. His leadership was instrumental to the unit being selected as the Army Aviation Association of America Logistics Unit of the year for 2016. Upon completion of his command at Ft Bliss, TX, in 2018, Colonel Hogan was selected to return to the 160th SOAR (Abn) for service as the Regiment Executive Officer (RXO) and led the organization to being selected as the Army Aviation Association of America's Outstanding Unit of the year for 2019.

Colonel Hogan completed the Senior Service College, Air War College (AWC) Maxwell AFB, AL and served as the Deputy Brigade Commander of the 160th Aviation Regiment prior to his selection to Command, Corpus Christi Army Depot. His awards and decorations are requisite for an officer with his time in grade and service.
